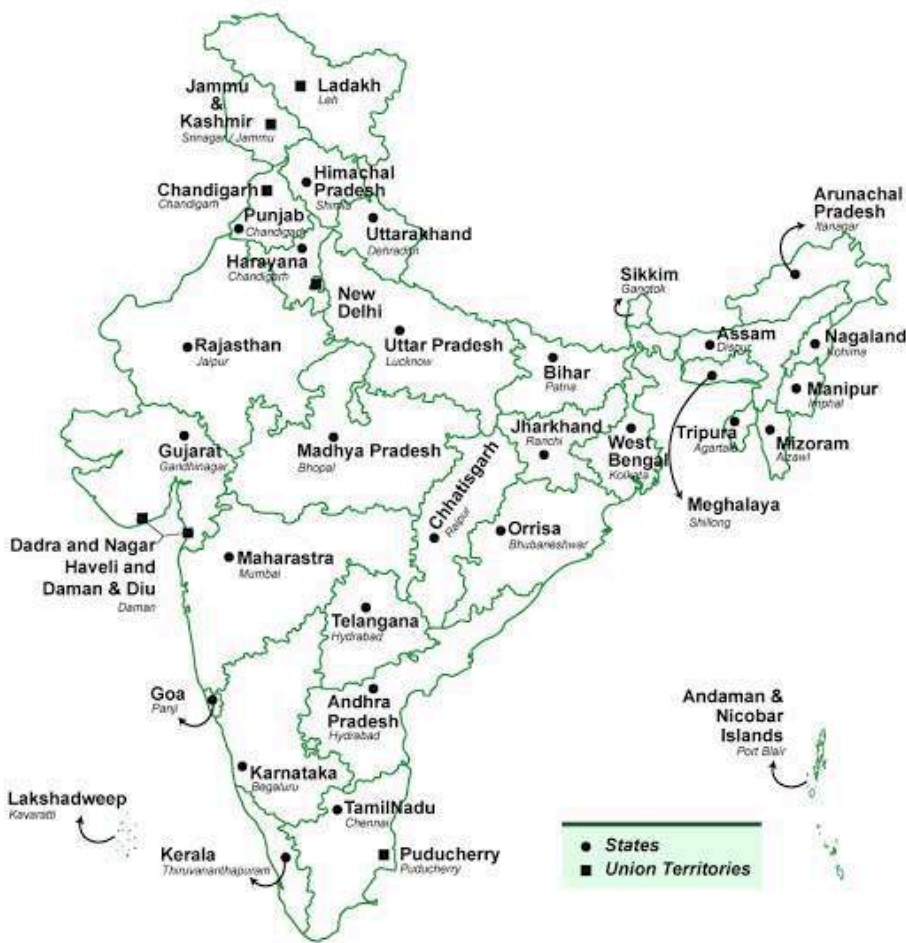

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TREATY, WARS & INVASION

- The rebellion was suppressed and Haradutta was killed. Biradutta had his eyes extracted and captured at Jorhat. Peace was established in Kamrup under the effort of Kolia Bhomora
- Being extremely happy at the valour shown by Kolia Bhomora, the King conferred on him the title "Pratap Ballabh"

FIRST BURMESE INVASION :

- The First Burmese invasion took place during the Chandrakanta singha's reign.
 - Badan chandra Barphukan become the Barphukan during this Period. He was the sole representative of lower Assam. He was responsible for inviting the Burmese to Assam.
 - On Badan chandra's request The Burmese king Badawpaya agreed to send some Army to Assam. on march, 1817, a garrison of 8000 men army despatched from Burma.
 - A war was fought in Giladharighat where Purnananda was defeated by burmese.

 - **1943** - Kushal Konwar hanged (on 15 June at the Jorhat Jail).
 - **1947** - Gopinath Bordoloi, became the first CM. and Sir Akbar Hydari became the first governor of Independent Assam. First medical college is established in Dibrugarh.
 - **1948** - Guwahati University was established. AIR started in Assam. Dr. T. Ao represented India in London Olympic. He was the Captain of the Indian Football team.
 - **1950** - Mega Earthquake rocked Assam on the 15 August. The magnitude was 8.6.
 - **1956** - ONGC was established at Nazira.
 - **1961** - Assamese becomes the state's official language.
 - **1962** - Inauguration of Saraighat Bridge. Guwahati Neharu Stadium was opened. China attacks India and Assam becomes the first victim.
 - **1963** - First mobile theatre of Assam Nataraj started by Achyut Lahkar. Nagaland separates out from Assam.
 - **1965** - Dibrugarh University was established. Publication of Dainik Asom newspaper
 - **1968** - Jyoti Chitraban was established at Guwahati
 - **1970** - Guwahati Tea Auction Centre established in Guwahati
 - **1974** - Kaziranga declared as National Park of India. Fakaruddin Ali Ahmed, the first Assamese, elected as the fifth President of India
